Within two hours he'd helped me plan the Garden Party and

offered most of his services for free! Wow! So this is what people mean when they say "God did it". He showed me the way!

Thank you, Hope House, for giving me the opportunity to work with you, and for teaching me that we can have a personal relationship with God. It really is that simple. Just trust and believe.

In 2008, the Residential Program added a new project, called Learning Lab. Our young moms now spend 20 hours a week in an off-site classroom working toward their GED or preparing for college. Our new teacher, Abby Fehr, leads these classes. In 2008, our Residents also participated in 100 hours of group parenting classes and 50 hours of individual parenting sessions. Parenting classes are taught by Shannon Jenkins. I am so proud of the courage and commitment of each young mom we serve!

MENTORING PROGRAM REPORT

Hi, my name is Lynn Martinez. I joined Hope House in November 2008 as the Mentoring Program Coordinator. In just that short time, the Mentoring Program has really taken off. Denver Public Schools would like us to pair over 100 teen mothers with mentors! The need is very apparent, and we are excited to offer our young moms a chance to work toward self sufficiency within a safe, caring relationship.

The Mentoring Program was piloted in 2008 with ten mentor matches. The program was initiated by our Parenting Coordinator, Shannon Jenkins, as a way to meet the needs of some of the 4,000 teen mothers in our community. Shannon has a master's degree in curriculum design, and developed a self sufficiency curriculum for our Mentoring Program in early spring, 2008. The program combines in-depth training, on-going support for the mentor, and regular reporting of the progress of the teen mother.

GED PROGRAM REPORT

In 2008, we began plans to open a GED Program to assist teen moms in the community with this crucial step toward self-sufficiency. At the beginning of November, our first student was enrolled and received her GED within 5 weeks! Our second student was enrolled before year's end.

With God as our guide we are able to offer:

- Official pretests which allow us to help each student with their specific needs
- · One-on-one tutoring in all 5 subject areas
- Support in obtaining the official GED, from a local community college, moving them one step closer to self-sufficiency
- · Transportation to and from the GED Program
- Help in obtaining day-care

Most importantly, we are sharing the love of Jesus through our program. Applications continue to come in, and it is our hope that 30 students will graduate from our program by the end of 2009.

What an amazing year for Hope House and our wonderful volunteers!

We began the year 2008 with the Volunteer Appreciation Breakfast in April. In June, our volunteers helped make the Ravenna Golf Tournament a big success. Next, the Annual Wassail Toast in November blessed all who attended. Finally, our annual Christmas Party in which Hope House volunteers provided food, gifts and abundant hope to 23 families.

• In 2008, the number of core volunteers increased from 50 to 80. These volunteers committed more than 2,000 hours in service.

• Church groups and Bible study, participation also increased this year, connecting several new groups with Hope House.

• Our Under \$20 Club participation increased from 80 members to 110. Hope House saved \$5,200 in household supplies in 2008 thanks to these volunteers!

• The first "Volunteer E-Newsletter" was created in October reaching approximately 75 volunteers.

• We had 43 volunteers work 1290 volunteer hours for our organizational needs.

The abundance of hope continues through our amazing volunteers who provide so many necessary services, baby-sitting, tutoring, transportation and more. Thank you to all our wonderful volunteers who served this year.



- 833 individuals invested in and financially supported Hope House.
- We received our largest grant to date a \$50,000 matching grant from Northwest Christian Community Foundation!
- A new event was added, "Hats Off to Hope House," raising \$67,000!

 - Program, staffed with its own director. We also served more teen moms through the Mentoring and GED pilot programs.
 - A \$31,648 profit partially reflects designated funds for medical and vehicle needs.
