




Summer

- Our many volunteers helped us finish the house and move in the girls on Easter eve in April
- Residents organized a "Volunteer Appreciation" and presented awards in August 2006
- A "New Volunteer Training Program" with a formal orientation and a required training session for all "direct service volunteers" was implemented in September 2006
- Our Volunteers committed over 1,500 hours, which saved Hope House approximately \$27,000
- Praise God Hope House has added 13 new volunteers in the last quarter of 2006


