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


It is the vision of Hope House to provide teenage mothers with hope...

1012 individual donors invested in Hope House in 2007.





Coming to Hope House has changed, and saved my life in so many ways. Before I heard about Hope House, I was living in shelters, and had been separated from my son for almost nine months. I had struggled with drug addiction, homelessness and domestic violence, and I was pregnant again at 16. I had almost lost all hope. I felt virtually alone as I battled to complete everything required of me to regain

custody of my son. My last task was to find safe housing for myself and my son, but there seemed to be no programs for a parenting teen under 18. Then my social worker told me about Hope House. A meeting with my social worker, my son's social worker, GAL's, counselors and family was held to discuss this option. Everyone decided that this was the best idea, and I was ensured success in my pursuance of my son. Before this option, my future seemed bleak, and my success was questionable.

I owe my life to Hope House, without them I would have lost my son. If I had lost my son, I would have lost the strength to parent my daughter, and I would be back on the streets, probably on drugs, and without hope of a future. Now I have my son, I have my daughter, I have God, and I have a life!

In September, Hope House received it's biggest grant ever! A \$50,000 matching grant, on condition we raise \$50,000 by 3-31-08!



Our volunteers have generously committed many hours to assist our residents with the daily tasks of transportation, babysitting, tutoring, etc.

Our residents have truly touched the hearts of volunteers in a "special way" and they are committed to writing personal "Thank you notes" weekly.

The updates for 2007 are:

- Many church groups participated in house improvements both inside and out (staining the deck, interior painting, gardening).
- Our Core Volunteers number approximately 50 and they generously committed over 1,800 hours of service.
- Our residents showed their appreciation by hosting a "Volunteer Appreciation Tea" in October.
- Praise God Our "Under \$20 Club" participation increased from 47 individuals to 85. Hope House saved \$4,800 on household supplies through the "Under \$20 Club".
- The "Welcoming Committee" and "The Christmas Committee" were created and volunteers signed up to help with these special events.

The year 2007 was a year of dreaming big dreams for our Community Programs, and building the framework to turn these dreams into reality for hundreds more teen moms in our Denver community!

In May, 2007 Hope House printed a Metro wide Resource Directory listing 230 organizations and services available in

the Denver metro area for pregnant or parenting teen moms. Over 200 of these directories have been delivered to individuals and service providers. The reaction to the Directory was so exciting, especially among the medical community! One nurse at Denver Health asked Hope House to speak to her staff, saying she felt that we could bring them light and hope!

The compilation of the Directory led to the discovery of "gaps" in help for young moms. Amazingly, those "gaps" matched the dreams that God had already laid on our hearts! So we set out to fill the gap! By December 2007 the development of our Advocacy Program was completed! This is a structured mentoring program with a curriculum designed to help teen moms meet specific self sufficiency markers with the help of a trained volunteer advocate.

What an exciting year it was, and we are filled with "passion for what is possible" in the coming year!

This was our first full year of operating the Residential Program in our beautiful new home in Arvada, Colorado. 13 teenage mothers and 17 children found safety, love and a second chance at stability within these walls. And outside of the Residential home, we expanded our reach and began laying the foundations for Community Programs that will touch the lives of hundreds more teen mothers and their children. The Resource Directory was printed and distributed, building new networks among

service providers all over Denver. The Advocacy Program was developed, a unique, structured mentoring program pairing teen moms in the community with trained volunteers. And the concept for the upcoming GED Learning Lab was born, creating a place for teen moms to work on their GED's while their children receive quality childcare.

Jeremiah 22:16 says, "For you defended the cause of the poor and needy...is that not what it means to know me?"

We truly believe that God has a plan and a promise for every teen mom and her child. It is our passion at Hope House to help them reach that promise. It is also our deepest prayer that each of you will experience God in your life as you join with us in this mission!
