The GED Program provides one-on-one tutoring in a small class environment to teen mothers wishing to earn their GED.

CHAMPION REPORT



Serving Hope House and the community has enriched and touched my life in ways I didn't think was possible. Helping the vulnerable spirit of teen moms and their children has done something I didn't expect...It has made me feel better about myself because I feel, in some small way, I'm making a difference in the lives of those who need help and love.

Hope House produces young professional women. These young ladies are making healthy choices which makes it rewarding to see them develop into caring and loving mothers. Who wouldn't want to be a part of an amazing organization like this?

I believe that 2009 taught us all that God is bigger than our economy, bigger than our fears, and bigger than I, personally, have ever given Him credit for. He is relevant, He is radical, and He is real. Just like you, Hope House was hard-hit in 2009. In February we made budget cuts of over \$100,000. Layoffs and salary cuts hurt, but due to the sacrificial love of our staff, not one Program was closed. In March we began asking the question that has been our mantra ever since. "What are we doing with what God's already given us?" Our funds might have been low, but our volunteer numbers had gone up over 30%. So when two sweet homeless sisters spent a night freezing in a park, and we didn't have the staff to house them, we turned to our volunteers and asked

a hard question. Would you be willing to work for free? Within three weeks we had filled every evening shift with trained volunteer staff. We also began recording our needs, even little ones, in a ledger. Then we'd wait, instead of rushing out to solve the problem ourselves. As the need was met, we'd record how, and the date, in the ledger. One day we recorded that we needed a microwave, and two hours later noted that one had been donated! In February 2009, we were serving 8 teen moms in the Mentoring Program – by December we had served 37. In February we had 5 teen moms in the brand new GED program, and by year end we'd served 17. Best of all, we were able to witness all of our teen moms begin to come together as a community, emphasizing to us how much they need to be with one another, with us as staff, and with you as their champions.

In 2009, we learned that God is unexpected, and creative, and that when we hope in Him, radical things happen!

PROGRAM DIRECTOR REPORT

What a year! 2009 came with gusto as we faced economic downturn and difficult financial decisions, matched with a marked increase in the need for services for our teenage moms. But even with decreased resources, God moved mightily! Not only were we able to keep all of our programs intact, we also experienced amazing growth in our programs. Our staff, mentors and volunteers all came together to meet the needs of our girls, and we did so with great success!

In the Residential Program, we provided seven teen moms and nine children with safe and stable housing. Brittany, one of our residents completed her C.N.A., graduated the Residential Program and is now living independently with her two daughters.

In Mentoring, 37 teen mothers were matched with a mentor who helped them move toward self-sufficiency. Each mom spent an average of four hours per week working with her mentor! We also offered parenting classes, counseling, school uniforms, scholarships and even two vehicles to teen moms in need!

In GED, we were able to offer not only individual tutoring for the GED, but also some childcare, and transportation. By the end of 2009, seventeen teenage moms had earned their GED. Even more amazing, twelve of those moms continued on to further education!

"My life has drastically changed ever since I came to Hope House and opened my heart to God." Last year, in 2009, I couldn't even picture myself here at Hope House and finally succeeding in life. I was broken-hearted and lost all faith in everything: my family, my friends and especially myself. On June 4, 2009 I was homeless and had nothing left. I slept in a park with my sister and her 3-month-old son. That night I felt so vulnerable and felt like my life was coming to an end. I started to lose faith in everything, but before I could, an angel took me in her arms and warmed my heart with radical hope. Her name was Lynn Martinez, the Hope House Mentoring Program Manager. On July 14, 2009 Hope House accepted me into the Residential Program.

My life has drastically changed ever since I came to Hope House and opened my heart to God. Now I'm in the best shape ever! I am enrolled in school at Red Rocks Community College. My daughter, Skarlett, just turned two and we now have a roof over our heads. The Residential Program has provided Skarlett and I with many things; clothes, diapers, parenting classes and everything else we need. I have been in the program for almost 7 months, and there's never a day that goes by that I don't ever regret my past. Now I know that God always walks with me no matter what and when things get hard God carries me.

GED PROGRAM REPORT

Radical Hope - What are we doing with what God's given us?

In 2009, Hope House expanded our community programs to include the GED Lab. We also focused on growing the Mentoring Program, which brought much Hope to teen moms in our community. God moved in a mighty way to provide volunteers with amazing gifts and talents to serve in a variety of new roles, including volunteer staff. It was evident throughout the year that God was filling our financial gaps through dedicated volunteers.

- 67 New volunteers came to serve at Hope House in 2009.
- Volunteers committed to serving more than 2,100 hours to the Hope House ministry. In addition, our GED Lab recorded 420 volunteer hours in tutoring teen moms.
- Our Under \$20 club increased to 120 members. This program saved us approximately \$5,400 in household supplies.
- Volunteers served at the Annual Golf Tournament, The Boutique and The Wassail Gala. They also joined together to make our annual Christmas Party a special event for 49 families.







In 2009:

- 901 donors invested in and financially supported Hope House. This reflects a 10% increase over prior year.
- Donations made by individuals alone increased nearly 23% during the course of the year.
- Fund-raising events continued to deliver net results comparable to prior years despite the challenging economy.
- A 4%, or \$25,187, reduction in total expenditures resulted primarily from G&A and program related efficiencies.


