



MISSION STATEMENT

FOUNDER & EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR REPORT



I was 14 when I started drinking and doing drugs. I was sent to an unlicensed facility that was eventually closed. After getting out, I was out of control and soon was pregnant. I was scared to death. After my son was born, I found Hope House, and I couldn't believe I'd finally found a place to belong. -Kyra, teen mom

Our young moms often feel judged, discouraged and even hopeless. The moment they walk into our Residential home or our Resource Center, they

know they've found a safe, warm, welcoming community that believes in them. This reality defined our focus in 2014: build community while expanding opportunities for teen moms to move toward self-sufficiency.

In January, the federal government privatized the national GED program, making it more expensive and much more difficult. Dedicated to our girls' success, we made many adjustments, such as quadrupling our number of tutors and adding a day of instruction to the weekly schedule.

We successfully launched our new Early Learning Program in February, providing 87 children with language development lessons while their moms attended our GED, College & Career, Parenting and Healthy Relationship classes.


I am proud to announce that last summer we initiated a Leadership Program for Hope House graduates because so many of these young women want a formal way to give back, whether hosting fundraisers or mentoring younger teen moms.

In December, we took the final steps to complete the purchase of the property that surrounds our Residential home in Arvada. This is vital in launching a capital campaign to build a new 7,500 square foot Resource Center and a 5,000 square foot Early Learning Center.

By the end of 2014, Hope House had empowered 134 teen moms to grow and learn while also finding a community – a family – a place to belong.

Kyra and little Blake are now living safely with her parents while she completes her first year of college – which she proudly points out she started a year early!

RESIDENTIAL PROGRAM

This year we made some changes to the Residential Program, making it possible for our teen moms to graduate more quickly. We also revised the healthy



relationships component of our program, leading to increased conversations with our residents about their relationships with young men and what they want them to look like in the future. I am happy to report that these new initiatives are creating a stronger learning environment for our residents.

We are also very proud of our 2014 graduates, Alondra and Kendra. Alondra is now busy working on her nursing degree after earning a full scholarship. Kendra is working as a Para Teacher and is enjoying married life with her husband Ross and their son Talon.

COMMUNITY PROGRAM

2014 was an exciting year for our Community Program as we grew in terms of how many teen moms we served as well as program expansion. One of the most important changes was the launch of our new Early Learning Program, providing free, quality childcare that focuses on language development for the children of our teen moms.

We also hired a Family Advocate to provide crisis and basic needs assistance for teen moms in the Community Program. These additions effectively removed significant



barriers for our teen moms, making it easier for them to accomplish their goals. This also led to an overall increase in participation in all of our programs, which are highlighted below:

GED

The federal government privatized the GED last year, and the new material is much more rigorous. We responded by adding more hours of instruction in our GED Lab and increasing our volunteer tutors from 8 to 30. We also created new teaching aids for our tutors as well as take-home learning materials. For some teen moms, the new GED curriculum proved to be too difficult, which led to our collaboration with an online high school. I am proud to say our teen moms persevered to complete their educational goals, a vital step toward self-sufficiency.



Parenting

When it comes to parenting, the topics are countless. Last year we offered 78 parenting classes, activities and discussion groups to address more of these topics – including specific topics requested by our teen moms. Lunch Bunch and Moms Night Out classes brought in record numbers, and we added classes to help moms learn about the specific age and developmental stage of their child. Field trips were a fun addition to the Parenting Program. Our teen moms and their children enjoyed visiting many sites such as the Butterfly Pavilion and the public library for story time.

Healthy Relationships

2014 was a year of innovation. For example, we invited couples to lead group discussions with some of our married teen couples, and it was wonderful to see the teen dads respond to the male speakers and express a genuine desire to create healthy relationships. We also began collaborating with a faith-based counseling center and referred many couples there. Our *Story of Hope* classes continued to run strong, with our teen moms showing high engagement and increased knowledge of healthy relationships skills. We are also excited to report that graduates are beginning to return to help lead classes or request counseling for themselves or play therapy for their children, indicating a mature level of awareness of their own emotional health.

College & Career Support

Entering its second year, this program is proving to be vital in helping our GED graduates stay on the road to self-sufficiency. We worked hard to help our teen moms complete college applications, see advisors, tour campuses, and schedule their classes. We are proud to report that we helped 12 teen moms gain acceptance into college! Once they started class, each girl regularly came to our Learning Lab for individual tutoring and support. We are even more proud to say that all 12 moms successfully finished their first semester of college. We also offered Job Readiness classes and job fairs and successfully helped 11 of our teen moms find employment through our Career Partner Program.

EARLY LEARNING PROGRAM

He kept picking out a book, climbing on my lap and asking me to "Read! Read!"

This is a perfect picture of what is happening in our new Early Learning Program. Earlier this year, you answered our call to action to support this program so that we could expand our hours and serve more children on our wait list, and **we are excited to announce that we served 87 kids in our first year of operation!**

Childcare is a common barrier to self-sufficiency. Removing this obstacle is critical to our teen moms' success. Just as important, we are providing the children of our teen moms with their first educational experience. We are utilizing the *Creative Curriculum* to promote literacy, and we offer free books for kids to take home after each session. We use open dialogue to build language acquisition and provide S.T.E.M.-based activities. The kids also learn about God's creation and his love for all children, while experiencing a safe, welcoming environment that promotes socialemotional growth.

All of these components lay important groundwork for further learning and a successful future for the little ones of our teen moms. *Hope House is now having an impact on two generations!*





VOLUNTEER REPORT



We LOVE our wonderful volunteers who constantly amaze us with their generosity. We were able to meet many needs in 2014 because they stuffed envelopes, provided childcare, mentored, cleaned, mowed and planned events... to name just a few tasks. Last year 245 volunteers gave 8,562 hours

FINANCE & OPERATIONS








SUMMARY OF EXPENSES*
