


DEVELOPMENT REPORT

This is the most we have ever served, and we could not have done it without your support! FOUNDER & EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR REPORT



As you will see below, 2015 was a big year for Hope House. Many exciting events throughout the year served to fuel our passion to provide our teen moms with expanded opportunities to work toward self-sufficiency AND advocate for them.

Early in the year Hope House and Florence Crittenton Services **co-founded a statewide collaborative of organizations working with teen parents.** The goal is to advocate for the removal of any barrier to self-sufficiency and provide a "one stop resource shop."

In April Hope House was the **beneficiary of the CoBiz Financial BizBash**, an annual concert that benefits two nonprofits. The proceeds allowed Hope House to finally purchase (and wrap!) two vans to provide transportation to GED and other classes!


In June **Hope House joined a GED Task Force**, hosted by the Colorado Center on Law & Policy, and **successfully advocated with the State Board of Education to allow choice in high school equivalency tests in Colorado**. Their decision came after Hope House testimony about driving our teen moms to Wyoming to take a test version not available in Colorado.

During the Fall we learned that after several years of applying, we were invited to host our 2016 golf tournament at The Sanctuary!

Most exciting of all, Hope House was awarded the Governor's Service Award for Outstanding Nonprofit Organization in the state of Colorado! This award is a humbling recognition of the work that Hope House and our amazing volunteers do as we walk alongside our teen moms on their journey to self-sufficiency.

RESIDENTIAL PROGRAM


The Residential Program offers a safe place for teen moms to live while helping them grow in multiple areas. An impressive 90 percent of graduates are at basic levels of self-sufficiency.

COMMUNITY PROGRAM

A record 155 teen moms were served through our Community Program in 2015! Other exciting news includes the implementation of self-sufficiency scores, which help us wrap the right services around each teen mom to help her grow in targeted areas and move closer to self-sufficiency. The year also included several other highlights:

GED

In order to help our teen moms finish their secondary education and move on to higher education or vocational school, Hope House began driving our teen moms to Wyoming to take the HiSet exam, a high school equivalency test that is much more approachable. Our graduation rate improved significantly – and the HiSet test will soon be available in Colorado!





College and Career

An impressive 93% of our GED graduates moved on to our College and Career Program, an essential step toward economic self-sufficiency. Hope House is also starting to receive more calls from business owners offering jobs to our teen moms!

Parenting & Early Learning

Along with the hundreds of parenting classes we offered, our Parenting Educator and Early Learning Coordinator paired up to offer Parent Teacher Conferences. Our moms were excited to hear about their child's progress and see how they can facilitate learning at home. We served a record-breaking 225 children last year, and 113 participated in our Early Learning Program!

Healthy Relationships

In 2015 Hope House piloted the use of a counseling intern through our partnership with Bridge Point Counseling Center. Having an extra counselor available allowed us to offer more counseling opportunities. Our girls continued to love our *Story of Hope* series, which specifically addresses teen moms and Healthy Relationships.

EARLY LEARNING

With much apprehension about being separated from her child, Hope House teen mom Sarah was not going to place her daughter Amoret in preschool. However, after Amoret spent 6 months attending our Early Learning Program, Sarah saw the benefits of a structured learning environment. Now Amoret attends a non-profit preschool fulltime with peers her own age, where she is thriving.

Our Early Learning Program is hightly effective and growing rapidly. In fact, over the past year, the Early Learning Program had a 30% increase in the number of children served, impacting 113 children! From field trips to the zoo, butterfly exhibit and pumpkin patch and animal visitors inside the classroom, the children enjoyed new experiences all year long. During parent-

teacher conferences, 20 teenage moms sat on the other side of the table, as the parent, discussing the next steps in their child's education. With excitement building about creating a solid foundation for future learning, 51% percent of the regularly-attending children moved into a new school setting, expanding their knowledge even more than before!

VOLUNTEER REPORT



2015 was a banner year for Hope House and much of the credit goes straight to our volunteers! They helped us provide 9,624 meals to our teen moms and their children, and our GED tutors donated 1,190 hours. Volunteer drivers also shuttled some of our teen moms to Wyoming to take the GED exam. A total of 333 volunteers helped us throughout the year with tasks from yard work to child care to float building. All together it added up to 9,200 hours of donated time, representing a monetary value of \$203,688. I cannot thank our volunteers enough for their hearts for our teen moms!

Our current #1 volunteer need - drivers! We recently launched *Hope Rides* to help our girls overcome the hurdle of transportation. Please contact me for details on this new opportunity to volunteer and get to know our teen moms and their kids at the same time.

Monthly Donors Make a Huge Difference at Hope House

FINANCE & OPERATIONS




SUMMARY OF EXPENSES*

Since Hope House first opened its doors, we have provided a safe place for teen moms and their children. Why? Because a staggering number of teen moms in our community face poverty, abuse or addiction in their own homes — or are simply homeless.

The truth is 67 percent of teen moms live below the poverty line, which is why Hope House is bursting at the seams. In fact, we helped a record-breaking 155 teen moms work toward self-sufficiency last year, breaking the cycles of abuse and poverty that defined their childhood... effectively empowering TWO generations.

Ground breaking on the Resource Center is scheduled for April 2016; we plan to break ground on the Early Learning Center in 2017.
