Derby Dash To Deliver
Arvada 5K/FunRun to Benefit Hope House of Colorado

(Arvada) The third annual Derby Dash, a 5K and Fun Run, will be held on Saturday, May 7, at Lake Arbor Park in Arvada. The race, which raises awareness and support for Hope House of Colorado's self-sufficiency programs for teen moms, is a fun event for the entire family.

An official Bolder Boulder qualifier, the Derby Dash has attracted notable runners in the past including Olympic-hopeful Ben Payne.

The morning will also include the shorter Fun Run and the Diaper Dash, a miniature race for toddlers. The Derby Hat contest allows runners to compete Kentucky-Derby style. Other events include a children's obstacle course, face painting and pictures with a real live princess or super hero.

"We really appreciate the support that Arvada has shown us since we opened our doors 13 years ago," said Lisa Steven, Executive Director of Hope House. "When the community shows our teen moms that they believe in them, it encourages them as they work hard toward economic self-sufficiency."

Last year over 225 people ran the Derby Dash. This year an even larger crowd is anticipated.
