Golfing for Good: The Sanctuary to Host Hope House Classic Joe Coors Chairs Committee

(Denver) Teen moms at Hope House are working hard to change the future for their children – and the Sanctuary, one of Colorado's most prestigious courses, is championing their efforts.

RE/MAX International Co-Founder Dave Liniger generously offered the Sanctuary golf course to Hope House as the site of the 12th annual Hope House Classic. Featuring 24 acres of gorgeous fairways, playing at Sanctuary is as stunning as it is memorable.

The modified scramble-format tournament begins at 11:30 a.m. and includes a competitive flight option. The day starts with brunch on the Sanctuary's expansive patio, and post-golf activities include a cocktail party, dinner and a live auction.

Foursomes are \$5,000 and sponsorships are available.

"We appreciate each of our golfers and our sponsors," said Lisa Steven, Founder & Executive Director of Hope House. "With their support, we served 155 disadvantaged teen moms and approximately 225 children last year, effectively empowering two generations."
