BY THE NUMBERS

For the past three years, over 2,000 babies have been born to teen moms in Colorado each year.¹ In 2023, the national teen pregnancy rate was 13.1% for every 1,000 teenage girls ages 15-19.²

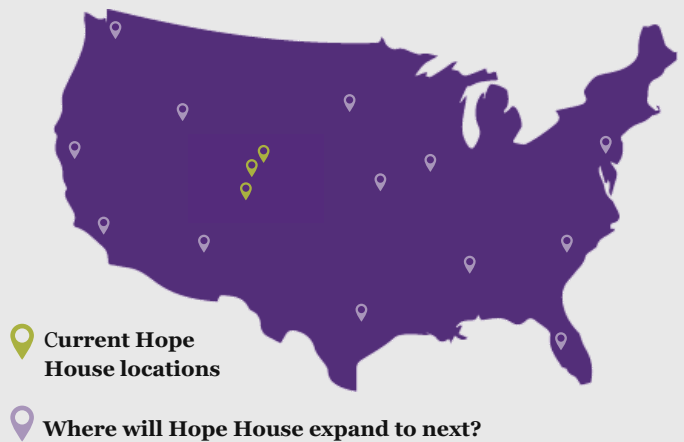

During her senior year, Grace found out she was pregnant with her son, Cebastian. Overwhelmed by the news, she kept her pregnancy a secret for months.

Instead of letting fear hold her back, Grace used it as motivation. She enrolled at Front Range Community College and started working toward her certificate in medical administration—all while preparing for motherhood. After graduating high school and welcoming Cebastian in October 2023, she threw herself into her studies, determined to create a stable future for him.

Grace first heard about Hope House Colorado from a nurse at the hospital where she gave birth. Hope House became a second home for her. She took classes like financial literacy, parenting and a CPR certification class. Events like Homework and Homies and fun activities with other moms gave her and Cebastian opportunities to form friendships. More than anything, Hope House became a place where she never had to feel alone.

Now, Grace is working toward her next goal: finding a job in the medical field and moving into her own apartment.
